How can you help?

- By talking to your children about taking care of their belongings.
- By labeling everything! Handwrite or use Mabels Labels (a fundraiser available through the school).
- By talking with your children about checking the "Lost and Found" frequently, or viewing
 the web pictures with them to see if together, you can identify any of the "left behind
 items" and bring them home.
