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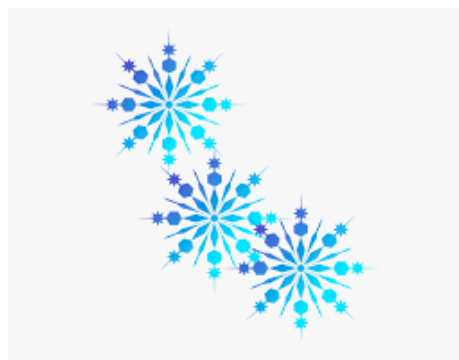
Mission: At KELSET School, our overall goal is "Success for Each Student". We want everyone in our school community to feel cared for, connected, capable and appropriately challenged.

Class Reps

We are looking for a volunteer from each classroom to be Class Rep! The Class Rep is a parent / guardian or other adult in a student's life who is willing to be the main connection between the students, their families, and the broader school community. We hope that our teachers will have a person in their class they can lean on to help them keep families up-to-date on what is happening within the school. The class rep role is quite simple, but important.

We have found that when parents/guardians receive emails from another parent/guardian in their child's class that they are more likely to remember and act on the information they receive. The class rep is a critical key for parental/guardian engagement with the school.



What does a Class Rep do?

- Attend monthly PAC meetings (3rd Wednesday of each month at 6:30pm, currently online) and share news with your class
- Help recruit volunteers for fundraisers and school events when needed (i.e. Grade 4/5 Reps will help recruit volunteers to plan Grade 5 Farewell)
- Assist the teacher with any other communications or jobs required (field trips, community walks, Christmas hampers, etc.)
- Organize teacher appreciation or class gifts if your class desires.

*** Please advise your classroom teacher if you do not consent to having the Class Rep contact you by email. ***

Please consider volunteering or sharing this role with another parent. If you are unable to attend PAC meetings, don't let that stop you from volunteering! We can send you our meeting minutes and you can share the important parts with your class that way.
