ADMINISTRATION REPORT

- School Supplies (Krista Hale) majority of teachers are happy with new way of getting supplies. ~1/4 of students haven't paid yet and a portion of these likely won't. Teachers have been told to cap their purchases at \$700. Krista requesting PAC funds for students that are unable to pay, as previously discussed at May meeting.
- Rainy Days (Jody Steele) request from teachers for one-time \$200/classroom for open-ended community building activities (e.g. lego, puzzles) for rainy days and for exploration time.
 Purchases would remain with the division if teachers were to move on from the school next year. 3 options discussed (meet in middle and increase classroom funds by \$100; give the \$200/class and take the funds from another area; fundraise – Night of Lights)
- Smooth start to the year 19 divisions, 396 students
- Newsletter coming out soon
- Weekly Monday morning assembly
- Terry Fox Sept 21st @ 2pm. All parents welcome. No Pets! Parent volunteers will be needed to cut oranges.
