- This needs to be discussed and part of the reason this isn't working IMO. We need to re-run numbers from teacher's perspective for those kids that brought their own school supplies, so we aren't funding deficit of school supplies and overfunding for classrooms that have had kids bring their own supplies. \$700/class even, funds need to be reduced by \$50/child for those that brings their own supplies. 33% of Grades 1-5 have not paid for school supplies this year (~100 kids) Do we relocate KELSET Cares money to cover these losses, and divert food money to cover this instead? Don't know how many brought their own supplies of these kids however. At a guess, 10-15% maybe bought own	Request Krista Hale attend January PAC meeting to discuss school supplies process
supplies, and some will not be able to afford the cost, but that leaves many families who haven't paid. So, we either have to increase average supply money, maybe \$240 was the extra people paid. The PAC will lose \$2100 if all teachers have spent their \$700.	Request admin to let PAC know how much school made with book fair
 Messaging to divisions needs to be very clear that its \$50 per student to a maximum \$700/division and the supplies stay in the division and do not move out of the school. In theory in subsequent years, the cost should decrease as the class should be adequately supplied with many tools that can be reused. - For 2020-2021 school year, admin have said they will document the below clearly:	

RELSET TATAL AND SCHOOL

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- o students who are unable to pay for school supplies
- o students who brought their own supplies.
- Fun lunch and supplies were accidentally linked together so it has been difficult to distinguish between them.

Classroom funds

- 20 divisions: 19 divisions plus French. We should ask for receipts for classroom funds/supplies (\$250) ... classroom funds include art room supplies, lego, disposable stuff. If disposable OK but if rainy day activities we expect these to stay in the division and not move out of the school at the end of the year to build up the school supplies.
- IF we made money or broke even on school supplies we could give some extra money, but we are losing every year now over \$2,000 plus giving \$5,000 = \$7,000 per year on classroom supplies which is a massive amount of money.

Other budget items discussed

- Total deficit is -\$3,051 right now.
- Alternate PE \$2,500
- Library \$750 school get a readers grant and book fair ask admin how much the school made, 25% of book value back to school.
- Science ventures \$2,000
- Arts \$2,000 Drumming and making drums this year
- Camp \$6,000: families pay a fee which is reduced by PAC funding comes from Spring Fair Raffle money plus specific fundraisers needed this year.
- Reflex math \$5,500 2 years, we are paying for 2019-2021
- Craft night \$600, but spent \$400 this year.
- KELSET CARES, add a cap \$4,750 to include belonging and connectedness and craft night where we put events that don't make any money then food costs will dissipate. Can the school reach out to get a grant for food and PAC top it up as needed? School should reach out to partners for grants for this need Sheralyn used to get grants for the food for school, Ashley will look into the North Saanich municipality Grant-In-Aid for this.
 - Note, NSMS school district budget covers all forgotten lunch costs, no money is required from PAC.
- Smile cards need to redistribute these to kindergarten and new families and remind people to use these, Marie to coordinate
- PAC Operations decrease to \$750, didn't use \$1,000 last year
- Teacher appreciation April pot luck, plus retirements, decrease to \$500 from \$1,000



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l	-	Field trips \$250/division; Field trip costs are increased at elementary

- Playground Fund \$5,000, additional government grants available for wellness and health that benefit more than the school community. Need help writing grants – post facebook post?
- Grade 5 farewell \$1,500 farewell book, DJ Moises need to organize up front to order books online at a reduced cost cf \$1,000 (plus \$10/book per child paid by families)
